PRIVATE ISSUE...GOVERNMENT SHOULD NOT INTERFERE: Many pro-choice people believe that abortion does not belong in the realm of government and is a "woman's private issue". This raises a fundamental question. Should we, as a nation, protect all human beings, or should we discriminate based on age, race and place of residence---in this case, the mother's womb. To say that government should let people make all their own choices is neither practical nor desirable. We should not, for example, let people commit rape, steal or drive drunk. Given the biological fact that the unborn are living human beings, the question is not whether the government has the right to prohibit abortion, but whether it has the right not to. The pertinent question is not whether a woman has a right to privacy, but whether her right to privacy supersedes her innocent child's right to life.
