ARE WE OBSERVERS OR “DOERS” IN THE ABORTION DEBATE?

Are we doing enough? The answer is an emphatic “no” as it is so easy to simply tune out and put this horror out of our minds and sight. Yet, nearly all violence done against human beings involves three types of people: the Perpetrator, the Victim and the Observer. This is sometimes called the “Tragic Triangle” With abortion, the abortionist, in collusion with the parent(s) is the perpetrator, the child is the victim, and the observers are all the rest of us. Some believe that we as observers have an equal or greater responsibility than the perpetrators because we can be more objective and if we were really motivated, we could stop this daily slaughter of the innocents. - Do one of your spouse’s chores without getting noticed.
- Seek understanding instead of the “last word.”
