

FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT AND ELECTIONS: As the election draws near, we are hearing more and more about health care, education, the war on terrorism, and other important topics. All of these are, to be sure, very important. However, the most important topic is the one that few people (particularly politicians) want to talk about: abortion. One might ask, "But how is abortion more important than quality education?" Easy. A child

cannot receive a quality education once he/she is aborted. It is certainly a noble goal to ensure that every child receives a quality education, but when one-third of children die before they reach kindergarten, we have failed in providing them with a quality education.

The same is true for other issues. Certainly children should have access to proper health care, but why is health care important? Health care is important because we value human life and seek to protect it from harm. Abortion, conversely, says that the purpose of health care is to destroy life, not to nurture it. In short, every humanitarian goal (and there are many of them) rests on the premise of the value and protection of human life.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM - ADULT TRAINING (VIRTUS) Effective Immediately In light of the current health conditions, one prudent and preventative measure we are taking is to make the VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults training available Online as an option. Effective immediately, due to COVID-19, the Archdiocesan requirement for attending a VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults workshop live session will be suspended and the option of the online version of the module can be offered in lieu of live training. This is a temporary safety precaution, and parishes may still offer the live training session available as an option if they prefer as long as the local county and state ordinances in effect at the time of the event are followed. Please note, the training must still be completed prior to participants working around youth, but the requirement may now temporarily be met by completing the online Protecting God's Children module. Individuals needing to attend a session will be offered the option of the online module at the time of registration. They will still need to follow the background screening and policy completion process at the time of registration. Individuals who are already currently registered for an upcoming live session, may log back into their account and change to the online module. These procedures will be reviewed and updated periodically as needed and are in place to protect you, those you work with, and your family. Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. (8/15/2020)

Texts:

First Reading: Rev. 11:19a, 12;1-6, 10ab

Second Reading: 1Cor. 15:20-27

Third Reading: Lk. 1:39-56

Theme: Mary Queen of Heaven and Earth

Congregation: St. Joseph-St. Lawrence Parish, Easton/ Kansas

Just imagine that you were the President of this Great Nation. What honor will you give to your parents, especially your mother in the White House where you will be living? You will probably give them/her a very comfortable place where they/she will feel at home with you when you are around. We all owe so much to our mothers who have carried us 12 months in their wombs. Caring for us with our daily needs for years until we are on our own. What we are in life is very much the making of our mothers. Thus, we give them special place in our lives.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today the Church rejoices together celebrating the great occasion of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God. On this day, we gather together to remember the glory and honor which the Lord gave to His beloved Mother, Mary, Blessed Ever Virgin, who has received graces and blessings beyond all other women and all other children of God. This feast is one of three feats of Mary that are Holy Days of Obligation for Catholics in the United States. January 1 is the feast of Mary the Mother of God, and December 8 is the feats of the Immaculate Conception of Mary.

What the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary? In order to understand this word, first of all we must distinguish it from the Ascension of the Lord Jesus into heaven. For at the Assumption, declared in the year 1950 to be a dogma of the church but has been believed since time immemorial refers to the moment when Mary was bodily assumed in the body and spirit, into the glory of heaven without passing through the process of death.

This is different from the Ascension in that, while the Lord ascended into heaven by His own power, glory and majesty, and by His own will, Mary was assumed into heaven by the grace and the will of God, and not by her own will and power. The Assumption of Mary was widely acknowledged by the Church teachings and tradition for many years before it was formally announced as a dogma in 1950, because of the church fathers' teachings on Mary, as the mother of God.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. The was celebrated under various names, commemoration, Dormition, Passing, Assumption, from at least the fifth and sixth century. Today it is celebrated as solemnity.

Scriptures does not give account of Mary's Assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, Revelation 12 speaks of a woman who is caught up in the battle between good and evil. Many see this woman as

God's people. Since Mary embodies the people of both Old and New Testament, her Assumption can be seen as an exemplification of the woman's victory.

Since Mary is associated closely associated with all the mysteries of Christ's life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to in Mary's share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and in heaven.

Today with universal Church, we affirm our belief that Mary, the Mother of God is the perfect model of Christian life; who was preserved from the corruption of the grave and who is the Queen of heaven and earth.

On this Solemnity, we are reminded that our destiny lies beyond the grave and each day we are being called to destiny. For that reason, we said these words in our Opening Prayer: "Always attentive to the things that are above, may we merit to be sharers of Mary's glory".

We cannot assume that we will go to heaven. We must strive daily to cooperate with the Lord's grace so that we may be prepared on the day He calls us to Himself. Mary shows us the way, Like her, we must, "proclaim the goodness of the lord and rejoice in God our Savior. Like her, we must with profound trust say daily: "Let it be done to me according to your word." In other words, as humble and faithful disciples our souls must magnify—not ourselves, but the One is Lord, the Son of God, the Son of Mary.

How blessed are we that from the cross he gave Mary to us as our Mother to guide us on our earthly journey and to the ultimate goal for which we long. Just yesterday we celebrated the Feast of St. Maximillian Kolbe who offered us this sound advice: We should let ourselves be guided by Mary and rest quiet and secure in her hands. She will watch out for us, provide for us; answer our needs of body and spirit and dissolve all our difficulties and worries" Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth, pray for us today and always.

Now brothers and sisters in Christ, as we reflect on this great Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, can we reflect on our own lives as well? Are we able to think through our every actions and deeds, all that we may have done in contrary of God's will, and caused by our greed and by our own wickedness? All these things that had led us into sin against God?

Let us all turn therefore towards God, and devote our whole attention to Him from now on, if we have no done so. Let us all look towards Mary, the Mother of our God, by whose intercessions, we have been helped each and every single days of our life. Let us all imitate her examples, her piety and commitment to God, that we mat also one day share in the same glory that God has given Mary, His Mother most blessed among women and most faithful among men.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, whom your Son has willed that you be worthy of assumption into glorious heaven, in body and soul, our beloved mother and guide, pray us all sinners, now and always and at the hour of our death. Intercede for us during this time of great stress, fear, anxiety and pain with this dreadful pandemic decease.

Amen.
