#### OTHER NEWS IN OUR ARCHDIOCESE

ABORTIONIST HAS TERRIFYING VISION AT MEDJUGORJE, CONVERTS ON THE SPOT: In 2011, an unlikely group of non-religious abortionist doctors found themselves visiting the most active Catholic apparition site in the world, Medjugorje. One of the doctors, a gynecologist in her sixties, had personally performed 1000s of abortions. But her life suddenly changed after having a supernatural vision on Apparition Hill!

The group was led by Valentina, a young woman from Ukraine. She had had her own conversion experience while visiting Medjugorje for the first time in 2007, and since then had been leading pilgrimages there. Inspired by Bl. Mother Teresa, Valentina had also dedicated herself to serving the sick poor. Her work got her connected with her local medical community, which led to her inviting the group of doctors to Medjugorje. An important part of their time in Medjugorje was climbing to the top of Apparition Hill, one of the first places Mary is said to have appeared to the child visionaries in 1981. That's when something incredible happened.

"I had scarcely put my foot down on the hill," the abortionist later explained, according to Mystic Post, "when everything changed before my eyes. "The rocks disappeared. The hill was suddenly covered with the bones and skulls of all the babies I had aborted over forty years. "Look at these hands!" she

cried out, stretching out her hands before the group. "Here are the hands which killed an entire city!"

With that, the doctor was done with abortions. Many of the other doctors in her group also had conversion experiences. In all, Valentina has taken somewhere around 400 abortion doctors to Medjugorje in the last few years. Whatever you make of the alleged visionaries, stories of conversion are always something to celebrate! Pray for the conversion of abortionists!

#### **VOTER REGISTRATION FOR THE 2020 ELECTION**

Election Day is Tuesday, **November 3rd 2020**. In order to be able to vote, you must be registered. The deadline to register to vote is Tuesday, **October 13<sup>th</sup>**. It is important to register especially if you recently turned 18, recently moved or had a name change, have not voted in recent elections, or if you are unsure if you have registered.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM - ADULT TRAINING (VIRTUS) Effective Immediately In light of the current health conditions, one prudent and preventative measure we are taking is to make the VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults training available Online as an option. Effective immediately, due to COVID-19, the Archdiocesan requirement for attending a VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults workshop live session will be suspended and the option of the online version of the module can be offered in lieu of live training. This is a temporary safety precaution, and parishes may still offer the live training session available as an option if they prefer as long as the local county and state ordinances in effect at the time of the event are followed. Please note, the training must still be completed prior to participants working around youth, but the requirement may now temporarily be met by completing the online Protecting God's Children module. Individuals needing to attend a session will be offered the option of the online module at the time of registration. They will still need to follow the background screening and policy completion process at the time of registration. Individuals who are already currently registered for an upcoming live session, may log back into their account and change to the online module. These procedures will be reviewed and updated periodically as needed and are in place to protect you, those you work with, and your family. #### 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A (9/20/2020)

Texts:

First Reading. Isaiah. 55:6-9

Second Reading, Phil. 1:20-27

Third Reading. Matt.20:1-16

Theme: Generous God.

Congregation: St. Joseph-St. Lawrence Parish, Easton/ Kansas.

Dear friends and brothers and sisters,

Warm greetings to you all. Wishing you all good health, and keep staying safe.

Today we celebrate the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Church invites us to reflect on the generosity of God. The Gospel of this Sunday is called the Parable of the Vineyard Workers. But more accurately, it can be called the Parable of the Generous Landowner. His action greatly surprised everyone. How can he give those hired very late in the day the same salary as those who worked the whole day? There seems to be no fairness here. However, fairness is not the issue here. Those hired early were paid the right salary as agreed upon with the owner. Justice has been served. Instead, the issue here is generosity.

It is not always easy to understand the ways of God. In the Gospel parable today (Mt.20:16) we see the workers failing to understand why those who worked just one hour received the same wages as those who worked all day. It reminds us of our futile attempts to understand why some people seemingly have been dealt a better hand than others going through life. Why does God apparently give more blessings to some than to others.

There is an ancient Islamic story about a man searching under a street lamp for a key he dropped. A neighbor saw him searching and joined the search for the key under the street lamp, but he did not find it either. "Where did you drop it?" his neighbor asked. The man said "Down the road there about fifty yards." The neighbor, somewhat puzzled, asked, "Well, why are looking here?

"The man said, "Because there is,

more light here." In our first reading today from the prophet Isaiah god tells us the same thing,

"Yes, the heavens are as high above earth,

as my ways are above your ways,

my thoughts above your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:9)

It is not always easy to understand God's ways. In any case it would be silly to be jealous of others because we only see the outside and we never know what cross others have to carry.

The landowner in the parable understood human nature very well when he said, "Why be envious because I am generous?" {Mt.20:15}. Those who worked hard in the heat all day were jealous of those who worked for only one hour and got the same pay. But instead of being envious and jealous of those who have been dealt a better hand than us there is a better attitude, to be grateful for the hand we have been dealt. If you envious of someone, stop for a moment and think of what life might be like if you were living in the same situation of need. If you feel that life has been unfair to you. The Bible has much to teach us to heal our attitudes. In many places the Bible teaches us that we have to give thanks to God at all times in all circumstances. In Eph.5:20 we read, Always, and everywhere, give thanks to God who is our Father". In 1Thes. 5;16-18 We read, "Be happy at all times; pray constantly and for all things give thanks to God, because this is what god expect to do in Christ Jesus. In Col.3:17 we read, "Whatever you say or do, let it be in the name of the lord Jesus, in thanksgiving to the father through him." So even when others prosper or have more success or better chance, what do we do? We can give thanks to God for the blessings he has given to them and the blessings he has given to us.

Another way of looking at this is that if God has blessed others greatly, he also expects much of them. Remember the parable of the Talents (Mt.25:14-30); the one with five talents made five more, the one with two talents made two more. To the one who has been much, much is expected. No matter what good fortune comes to others it really doesn't matter because as followers of Jesus our aim is to use everything for the kingdom of God. In Matt. 6:33 we read, "Seek the kingdom of God first and all these other things will be given you as well"

There is another way I would like to look at this, God has a perfect plan for your life. If others have more than you, it does not mean that God loves you less. God loves each of us specially. In the parable, the landowner-representing God-said, "My friend, I am not unjust to you." (Mt.20:13). God is our friend and is not unjust to us. Think of parents and children. Parents have different relationship with each child but love each child. God deals differently with each of us, because God loves each of us in the way that God knows best for us and his kingdom. The attitude to have is one of trust in God.

"My friend, I am not being unjust to you...I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous."
