WHY WE CATHOLICS, BOTH CLERGY AND LAITY, NEED TO DO MORE...MUCH MORE! Since Roe v. Wade in 1973, more than 60 million innocent children have lost their lives to abortion. Clearly, abortion is the human right's issue of our time. So on our judgment day, Christ might well ask us, "what did you do to prevent the holocaust in your society?"

The Catholic Church remains the most vocal voice on behalf of the 4,000 innocents, made in God's image and likeness, who every day lose their lives in our great nation. However, the Church certainly has not lived up to its possibilities, in large part because its hierarchy and its rank-and-file lay people have been intimidated into silence, inactivity and even apathy. Sadly, only a very small percentage of Catholics do anything to prevent the slaughter. Even some of our clergy deem the subject "too political" or controversial or find some other reason to excuse themselves from taking any action.

The famous Dr. Bernard Nathanson, a founder of the abortion industry who later became pro-life (and converted to Catholicism) said that he and his pro-abortion allies would never have gotten away with what they did if the clergy had been more outspoken, united, and purposeful. This certainly applies just as much (if not more) today than it did in 1973 when abortion was legalized. We would do well to heed and keep foremost in our minds the wise words of Mother Teresa when she said, "We cannot fight credibly against other social and moral evils, including poverty and violence, while we tolerate mass killings by abortion.

"Above all, the common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights -- for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture -- is false and illusory if the right to life, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum --Pope John Paul II

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM - ADULT TRAINING (VIRTUS) Effective Immediately In light of the current health conditions, one prudent and preventative measure we are taking is to make the VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults training available Online as an option. Effective immediately, due to COVID-19, the Archdiocesan requirement for attending a VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults workshop live session will be suspended and the option of the online version of the module can be offered in lieu of live training. This is a temporary safety precaution, and parishes may still offer the live training session available as an option if they prefer as long as the local county and state ordinances in effect at the time of the event are followed. Please note, the training must still be completed prior to participants working around youth, but the requirement may now temporarily be met by completing the online Protecting God's Children module. Individuals needing to attend a session will be offered the option of the online module at the time of registration. They will

still need to follow the background screening and policy completion process at the time of registration. Individuals who are already currently registered for an upcoming live session, may log back into their account and change to the online module. These procedures will be reviewed and updated periodically as needed and are in place to protect you, those you work with, and your family. First Sunday Of Advent, Year A. (11/29/2020).

Texts:

First Reading. Isaiah 63:16-17, 64:1-8 Second Reading. 1Cor. 1:3-9

Third Reading. Mk.13:33-37

Theme: Advent: Season of Great Expectation and Joyful Hope.

Congregation: St. Joseph of the Valley- St. Lawrence Parish, Easton/ Kansas.

Good morning/evening my brothers and sisters in Christ. The atmosphere is that joy in preparation for Christmas, the birth day of Jesus Christ, the savior of the world, the son of God. All the stores are filed wit good, and Christmas decorations and Christmas hymns.

Today we begin the Advent season B, the season of preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas. Naturally, we all desire peace because, it is necessary for both our spiritual and material progress. It is this peace that we pray for, and expect Jesus the prince of peace to bring to our hearts, families and world at the end of this season.

The term Advent comes from two Latin words "Ad-ventus" which simply means "to arrive" or "Advenire" meaning "to Come". For us Christian, and Catholics in particular, it means expecting the Lord's coming. Advent marks the beginning of the Church's new liturgical calendar. It is a four- week preparation leading to Christmas. Advent is a season of expectation, anticipation and a season of waiting in hope. It is a season of hope and a period during which as Christians we await the fulfillment of the promise of God through his prophets. In addition to being a season of hope, it is equally, a season of patience and prayer. During these four weeks, what are we expected to do? We are expected to prepare for the birth of the messiah. It suffices to note that while we prepare physically, the most important must be the spiritual preparation.

Our first reading from Isaiah is both a prophetic message as well as a prayer of hope. Isaiah begins by acknowledging the greatness of God: "O Lord you are our Father, Our Redeemer is your ancient name..."Then, he makes a petition to God: "Why leave us to stray from your ways...Oh that you would tear the heavens open and come down...?"

This is a prayer of hope. As Isaiah rightly demanded, God will not keep silent until we are saved. That salvation is what our hope in Christ will accomplish for us. Therefore, when Isaiah asks God to tear the heavens and come down, he expects God to come quickly.

This is Our Lord's prayer, "Your Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven." It is also Paul's petition, "Maranatha!" It is the cry of the Spirit and the Bride: "Come Lord Jesus". God power and salvation is what we hope to see at the end of this season. That is, When God's word would become flesh and born of a virgin.

In our second reading, Paul encourages us to be faithful as we wait for the coming of Christ. Though Paul was referring to the Parousia, yet, this reading is ad rem to the season of Advent. Paul reminds us

that we have received the gifts of the Spirit. It is these gifts of the Spirit that will strengthen us as we wait in joyful hope for Christ.

Our life is a long vigil, waiting for the lord to be revealed in all his glory. So, we wait with expectation and joyful hope because His Spirit is with us. If we walk with him in this season, God will not fail us because: "our expectation shall not be cut short (Pro. 23,18). So as the Spirit guides us, we must prepare prayerfully, through the help of the Sacraments. This especially, through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The gospel today is a clarion call to be awake and alert. Only the spirit of god can help us to do this faithfully. Therefore, rather than obey the spirit of this world this season, we must obey the Spirit of God who sustains us. So, let us have our minds fixed on him.

It suffices to note that if we light up our houses and streets, without lightening up our lives spiritually for Christ to walk into it; if we prepare all things and places without preparing a manger for baby Jesus in our lives then, our preparation would not be complete. The season of Advent is another opportunity the church offers us to learn and especially re-examine our lives and make amends. We are called to fast and pray in order to celebrate purity of heart and in the joy of the Lord. It is a call to let the faithfulness of God change our unfaithfulness, to let the commemoration of the mystery of the incardination open our eyes, how much God loves us.

Finally, as we eagerly anticipate the coming of the Lord this season, our hope and expectation should prompt us to be always awake and vigilant. It should make us prepare adequately in order to avail ourselves of Jesus' mercy. Therefore, our constant prayer during this season as Paul prayed should be: "Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus.
