THE WORD ADVENT MEANS

COMING This joy-filled season is our annual preparation to celebrate Jesus' birth Our waiting and preparation for Christmas Day, though, symbolizes our waiting and preparing for the Lord's coming at the end of time, which is the theme of today's Gospel. Jesus warns us to be always prepared because He is coming back at an hour we least expect. "Stay awake," the Lord tells us.

It is important that we not only prepare for Christmas, but it is even more important we prepare to meet the Lord when He comes again. Spiritually, that means we need to clean house (go to confession), put out the welcome mat (being extra hospitable toward others), and wait in joyful hope for Jesus' coming.

May we ready ourselves, so that when Jesus comes He will find a welcome place in our hearts. Let every heart prepare him room!

ADVENT WREATH PRAYER: An ancient custom used to mark these weeks before Christmas is the Advent Wreath. We have one in church, and everyone is encouraged to have one at home.

The Advent Wreath itself is very symbolic: the circle of evergreen represents God's everlasting love, which has no beginning or end. Green is the traditional color for hope — the hope that comes into the world with the birth of our Savior. The candles are symbols of Jesus, the Light of the world.

Here is a prayer you may use when lighting the first Advent Wreath Candle this week: Almighty God, as we enter into this Advent season, we ask You to continue the work of our salvation begun in Your son, Jesus. Let Your blessing come upon us as we light the candle on this wreath. Turn our hearts to You. Prepare us to welcome Your Son, Jesus, Who
