FOOD PANTRY ALERT: As of the end of February, the emergency allotment of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) - a temporary increase to address food insecurity during the pandemic has come to an end. Consequently, eligible low-income households will face significant reductions in their assistance, which will put a serious strain on our Catholic Charities Food Pantry in Leavenworth. To meet this increased demand, our parish's weekly collection of food will be more essential than ever before. The pantry's ongoing needs include peanut butter and jelly, canned or plastic containers of fruit juice, canned fruits and vegetables, small bags of pinto beans, black beans, rice, or barley, powdered milk, spaghetti sauce, tomato sauce, oatmeal, cereals, breads, pastas, crackers, tortillas, canned meats and fish, soups, boxed dinners, and personal hygiene items. If you donate pancake mix, please consider donating syrup as well. Please continue to leave your nonperishable items in the bin located in our church vestibules, and they will be delivered to Catholic Charities. Thank you for performing this vital corporal work of mercy.
