VOTIVE CANDLES: Lighting a candle for prayer-or to express a personal need, like during a candlelight vigil after a tragedy—is a natural human gesture and a treasured Catholic tradition. When we light a votive candle, we're expressing our hope and trust in God. Even after we leave the church, the flame keeps burning, symbolizing that our prayer continues. The candle also reminds us of Christ, the Light of the World, who leads us through every kind of darkness. Sometimes candles are placed near statues of saints as a way of asking for their intercession-like asking a holy friend to pray with us. It's a simple act, but full of meaning. Whether in joy, sorrow, or a special need, lighting a candle reminds us that our pravers continue, glowing with hope. Votive lights are available in both of our churches. CATHOLIC Q&A:

Can Catholics receive communion in other churches?

While we deeply long for unity with all Christians, Catholics are asked not to receive communion in other Christian churches. This is because the Catholic Church believes that the Eucharist is fully present only through the ordained priest's special role in the Catholic Mass. This is an essential part of the Church's understanding of the Eucharist as the true Body and Blood of Christ. In other Christian traditions, communion is a representation or symbol of Christ's body and blood, and they are correct about that since they do not have the priesthood in apostolic succession. While we respect other traditions, the Catholic Church believes that the fullness of Christ's presence is only realized in the Mass celebrated by a Catholic priest.

When a Catholic does not receive communion in another church it is not meant to be a rude rejection or a refusal of hospitality, but rather an acknowledgment that we are not yet in full communion together. We don't believe the same thing in regard to the Eucharist. While we eagerly hope for the day when all Christians can share in the Eucharist together, this practice helps us honor the sacredness of the Eucharist and preserve its profound meaning for Catholics.

We warmly invite others to explore the Catholic faith. If they come to share our faith in the Eucharist, we'd be overjoyed to welcome them to receive Communion in full unity!

PRAYER REQUESTS. From time-to-time special needs arise in one's life: personal or family crisis, illness, death of a loved one. One prays, of course, but our petitions are more powerful when we lift up our prayers together. The members of our parish prayer team take time to pray every day for people's prayer requests.
