CATHOLIC Q&A: Can Catholics with Alzheimer's Receive Holy Communion?

Yes. Catholics with Alzheimer's or other forms of dementia can and should be offered Holy Communion if they show even a simple or distant awareness of the sacrament and a desire to receive. They should never be forced, but offered Communion with kindness and respect.

The sacraments are not rewards for understanding but gifts of grace, especially in times of weakness. Even through the fog of memory loss, if a person can even vaguely recognize the Eucharist as something sacred — or shows reverence (by reaching out, saying "Amen," or a prayerful expression), they may receive. In these situations, the minister should presume in favor of giving Communion, unless there is a clear reason not to.

Though dementia may cloud the mind, it cannot erase the heart's longing for Christ. The Eucharist continues to offer deep peace and communion with God. If your loved one is living with dementia and would like to receive Communion. please speak with your priest. We are here to walk with you in care and compassion.
