OUR 2nd READING from St. Paul reminds us of the heart of our Catholic faith: Christ died for our sins, was buried, rose on the third day, and appeared to many. This is a life-changing truth! The resurrection is our hope, our foundation, and our joy.

If Jesus conquered death, then no struggle, sin, or suffering is beyond His power to redeem. We are called to live as people of the resurrection, trusting that God is always bringing new life, even in our darkest moments.

Paul also emphasizes that this Gospel is something "we have received." Faith is not just personal; it's a precious gift passed down through the Church. Every time we receive the Eucharist, we proclaim this same truth: Christ is alive, and we are one through Him and with Him and in Him. So, let's live with confidence, knowing that His victory is ours!


