By next weekend, it is quite possible we will have a new pope. On Wednesday, the cardinals will enter conclave to begin the election. The word "conclave" comes from Latin and means "with a key," because the cardinals are sequestered inside the Vatican's Sistine Chapel during the voting to keep the process private and free from outside influence. Only cardinals under the age of 80 can vote, and they cast secret ballots. A man needs two-thirds of the votes to be elected. After each round of voting, the ballots are burned. If no one is elected, the smoke rising from the chapel chimney is black. White smoke means a pope has been elected and will soon be introduced to the world. When this happens, the news will spread very quickly across all platforms, and the focus of the world will be on Saint Peter's Square in Rome.

I invite us all—each one of us—to pray this prayer each day until it is announced, "Habemus Papam," We have a pope!— "COME, HOLY SPIRIT, breathe Your wisdom into the hearts of the cardinals. Guide them in this time of choosing a shepherd after Your own heart. Give us a pope who will be a good and generous pastor, who will proclaim the victory of Christ's Resurrection, defend the weak, and seek to bring unity to the Church.
